

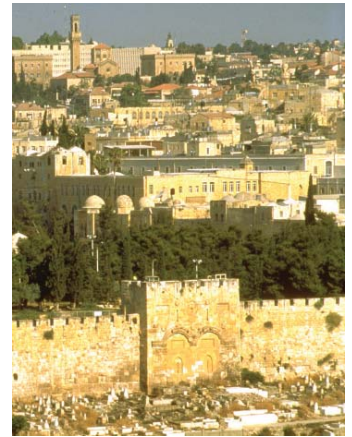
Religious Diversity In Israel and Palestine

June 14–27, 2011

Co-led by **Dr. Pauline Coffman and Dr. Paul Parker**

Join Dr. Coffman and Dr. Parker to...

- ...discover the religious diversity of Israel and Palestine
- ...explore the impact of political conflict on religious practice
- ...consider religious resources for a just resolution of the political conflict



Participants in **Religious Diversity in Israel and Palestine** will explore the six religions of Israel and Palestine in their cultural richness and political reality. This is a listening tour: we will take notice of devotees' concerns, observe religious practices, discern group beliefs and values, visit many of their holy sites, and ponder the religious experiences of the peoples of Israel and Palestine—the Baha'i of Acre and Haifa; the Druze of Golan Heights; the Samaritans of Nablus; the Jews of Jerusalem and the settlements; the Christians of Nazareth, Bethlehem, and Jerusalem; and the Muslims of Hebron, Ramallah, and al Quds. Special attention will be given to the diversity of Jewish life, the vibrancy of Islam, and the ten Christian communities officially recognized as indigenous. In the midst of political conflict and social upheavals, how have such beautiful and richly textured religions survived?

Religious Diversity in Israel and Palestine is not a... Holy Land tour—although we will visit many incredibly sacred sites.

It is not a religious pilgrimage—although our time in Israel and Palestine may be profoundly spiritual.

It is not a political fact-finding mission—although everything is political.

And it is definitely not a tourist's vacation—although we will swim in the Dead Sea; shop in the Old City; munch on Arabic salad; and devour falafel.

We will visit Yad Vashem and the Wailing Wall; climb Masada, Mt. Olives, and Mt. Gerizim; marvel at the Harem al Sharif's Dome of the Rock and al-Aqsa Mosques; explore Crusader ruins; meet a "good Samaritan"; fall silent at the burial site of the Patriarchs; gaze at the birth and burial sites of Jesus; admire the wisdom and the mosque of Omar; eat fish from the Sea of Galilee; weep at the Valley of Tears; and celebrate life.

Dr. Pauline Coffman has experience leading seminars to Lebanon, Syria, Jordan, and Israel/Palestine. She studied in Beirut as an undergraduate and is active in the Middle East Task Force of Chicago Presbytery.

Dr. Paul Parker has been a professor at Elmhurst College (Elmhurst, Illinois) since 1987 where he teaches courses in Christian social ethics, world religions, and religion in America. He has experience leading student tours to India, Turkey, and Jordan.

Tuesday, June 14 **Departure**

Depart Chicago's O'Hare International Airport on a transatlantic flight to Tel Aviv.

Wednesday, June 15 **Tel Aviv / Jerusalem**

Arrive this afternoon at Tel Aviv, Ben Gurion International Airport and be met by our guide and travel to Jerusalem via motor coach. Enjoy a brief walking tour of the Old City before dinner and overnight at an Old City hotel.



Thursday, June 16 **Jerusalem**

Visit to Yad Vashem, the Holocaust Museum this morning. Drive to Sabeel Ecumenical Theological Center for a brief Bible study, the Eucharist, and join in "The Wave of Prayer," followed by a light lunch. Hear about the "effects of Zionism on the Palestinian Christian Communities," the work of Sabeel, or a topic related to religious diversity of Israelis and Palestinians. Participate in an evening discussion on the role of the Holocaust in Israel's identity. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.

Friday, June 17 **Masada / Dead Sea**

Drive to Masada this morning, taking the cable car to this historical site to discover its contemporary political significance. Masada, Herod's mountain fortress was the last stand of the Jewish revolt against Rome. On the journey back to Jerusalem, stop for a swim in the mineral rich waters of the Dead Sea where it is impossible to sink! This evening, enjoy a discussion on the role of Masada in Israel's identity. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.



Saturday, June 18 **Jerusalem**

Visit the Wailing Wall this morning, one of the holiest Jewish sites, in order to observe the state established religion. Next visit the Harem al-Sharif (Dome of the Rock) and witness the limits of 'religious freedom' in Israel. Visit with Bishop Munib Younan (Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land, ELCJHL), Patriarch Michael Sabbah (Latin Catholic Church), or the Maronite Convent of Jerusalem for an overview of the effect of Zionism on their churches.

This afternoon, visit with individual representatives of Jewish pro-Zionist groups and Jewish anti-Zionist groups: ultra orthodox, settlers, and other conservative religious parties as well as secularists. Enjoy some free time to explore Jerusalem on your own this afternoon. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.

Sunday, June 19 **Jerusalem**

Walk the Via Dolorosa (Way of Suffering) and conclude with morning worship in the Old City Lutheran Church or at St. George's Anglican Church. Visit the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, followed by an afternoon or evening discussion with Dr. Mustapha Abu Sway (or another Muslim representative) on the importance of prayer at al Aqsa and the effect of the Israeli/Palestinian conflict on Muslim religious practice.

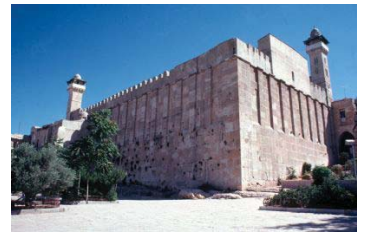


Monday, June 20 **Bethlehem**

Drive to Bethlehem this morning to visit the Mosques of Omar (and the older first mosque outside Bethlehem, if time permits) and learn their history. Visit the Church of the Nativity to see the star that marks the birthplace of Christ. In the afternoon visit Bethlehem University for a tour and lecture/discussion on the effect conflict has on the religious practice of Palestinians. Visit with Jad Isaac, Director-General of the Applied Research Institute of Jerusalem to discuss "The Economic Impact of the Israeli/Palestinian Conflict on Palestinian Christians, Churches and Denominations."

Tuesday, June 21 **Hebron**

Drive to Hebron's Tomb of the Patriarchs to witness the restrictions placed on religious freedom – and visit the Old City and market. Spend time with Hebron families, a religious leader or possibly a refugee camp to learn about the effect of the Israeli/Palestinian conflict on their religious practices. Visit a settlement and listen to the effect of the Israeli/Palestinian conflict on the religious practices of Jewish settlers. Later in the day, visit the Greek Catholic Church of Bethlehem (Father Yacoub Abu Saada) and the Greek Orthodox Church of Beit Jala (Father George Shahwan) on the return to Bethlehem for dinner and overnight.



Wednesday, June 22 **Ramallah**

This morning, drive to Ramallah to visit al Mukata, an important cultural and political center for the Palestinian National Authority. Yaser Arafat's tomb is inside this compound. Learn about Christianity in the West Bank from Christian group leaders such as Ms. Jean Zaru of the Friends, Dr. Mustafa Barghouti, and others. Dr. Hanna Nasir and Mr. Sam Bahour will discuss the political and economic situation of Palestinians. Mrs. Tania Nasir will discuss the "Impact of Israeli/Palestinian Strife on the Arts in Palestine." If time permits, visit the Edward Said Conservatory to learn how the Israeli/Palestinian strife has impacted music in Palestine. Dinner and overnight in Ramallah.



Thursday, June 23 **Nablus**

Drive to Nablus (biblical Shechem) to meet Samaritan leaders and for a tour of the Samaritan museum on Mt. Gerizim, the Samaritan Israelites' holy place. Visit the site thought to house Joseph's Tomb. Meet with Greek Catholic Church pastor, Father Yousef Sa'adeh, to understand the state of the church in Nablus and its contemporary relationship with Muslims, Jews, and Samaritans. If time permits, enjoy a walking tour of Old Nablus. Overnight in Nablus.

Friday, June 24 **Nazareth**

Depart early this morning for the Golan Heights. Visit the Druze village of Majdal Shams and meet the secular Druze civil rights leader for a lecture/discussion on "The Druze of Golan." Visit the "Valley of the Tears," where the fiercest battles of the Yom Kippur War took place. Drive to Nazareth, the boyhood home of Jesus. See the Church of the Annunciation, built on the traditional spot where the angel Gabriel prophesied to Mary.

Listen to local activist imams, such as Nazem Abu Salim, a leader of one of the Muslim groups in Israel (Northern Islamic Movement) that called for a boycott of Pope Benedict's visit to Nazareth. Dinner and overnight in Nazareth.

Saturday, June 25 Ibilin / Haifa

Drive to Mar Elias Educational Institution in Ibilin for a tour and overview of the history of MEEI. If possible, meet with Archbishop Elias Chacour of the Melkite Catholic Church, who will share his experience as a Palestinian Christian in the State of Israel. Visit Daliyat el-Carmel, a Druze village with a mosque that was recently renovated in 2008. Enjoy a class discussion comparing these Druze with the Druze of Golan. Continue to Haifa for dinner and overnight.



Sunday, June 26 Haifa / Acre

Today's explorations will include the services of a Bahai guide, beginning with the Bahai Gardens of Haifa, surrounding the shining golden dome of the Bahai Shrine, the world center of the Bahai religion. Drive to Acre (Akko) to see the Bab's memorial, with an introduction to Bahai by a devotee. After dinner, drive to the airport for a late-night departure.

Monday, June 27 Return to USA

Arrive Chicago late this morning.

The Middle East Task Force was appointed in the fall of 1974 by the Committee on Church and Society of the Chicago Presbytery, to implement the recommendations of the 186th General Assembly that "presbyteries encourage study and foster dialogue in response to the current Middle East conflict." One of its purposes is "to serve as a support network to Christians in the Middle East," and this special tour will help to "fulfill our educational, support, and advocacy missions" and "to work in tandem with other organizations who share our commitment for a peaceful, just, and non-violent resolution of the Middle East conflict."



Siraj Center for Holy Land Studies is a non-governmental nonprofit organization based in Beit Sahour, Palestine. It aims to create links between Palestinian people and people from around the globe through educational tourism, interfaith and ecumenical dialogue, culture and youth exchange programs. Through its many local connections, Siraj works directly with communities and organizations in Bethlehem, the West Bank, Palestine and the Holy Land, and the entire Middle East. Siraj center also aims to reveal the human face of the people of Palestine that is not shown normally at Western Main stream media, by organizing interaction with local Palestinians families.

Tour Features and Conditions

Please read all Tour Features and Conditions carefully.
Payment of tour deposit constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

Air Transportation: Air transportation is restricted to the services of any IATA carrier, in economy class based on nonrefundable fare. Travelers are responsible to provide their names as they appear in their passport. Ticketing will be made 30-45 days prior to departure, after which there will be a charge for name corrections. Tour price includes current airline taxes of \$94, which are subject to change until ticketed. *Tour participants are responsible for any increase in airline taxes imposed by the airline.*

Accommodations: Based on two or more persons sharing a room in accommodations listed in itinerary, or similar. Single rooms are subject to availability at an additional charge of \$395. *If a passenger cannot supply a roommate, the passenger is responsible for the additional charge.*

Meals: In-flight meals and snacks are served according to airline policy. Breakfast and dinner will be provided daily. Beverages with dinners are not included. Opportunity will be given for participants to purchase lunches on their own.

Transfers and Baggage: Transfers between airports and hotels upon arrival and departure are included in the tour price, including handling of one medium-sized suitcase per person, not exceeding 62 dimensional inches (length plus width plus height) or weighing more than a maximum of 50 pounds. *Due to limited luggage storage space on motor coaches, it is **important** that each person bring only **ONE piece** of checked baggage. In addition, a flight bag or overnight case may be taken, which must be handled by the passenger at all times. Baggage allowance is subject to change according to airline policy.*

Sightseeing and Entrance Fees: Are included as indicated in itinerary, using private motor coach or other conveyance, with local guides where necessary.

Tips and Taxes: Service charges and taxes on accommodations are included. Tips to guides, drivers, and hotel staff are included, as well as donations and honoraria to organizations and speakers. Tips for personal services are not included and are at tour member's own expense.

Not Included: Passport fee, travel protection insurance, and expenses of a purely personal nature are not included. Transportation from your home to Chicago/O'Hare International Airport and return is not included. Checked luggage fee(s) charged by the airline.

Deposit and Payment: Reservations may be secured upon payment of a deposit of \$500 per person. You will be invoiced for final payment, which is due April 15, 2011.

MTS Cancellation Conditions: Refund of full deposit (less \$100 administrative fee) will be made up to March 9, 2011. If cancellation occurs between March 10 and May 10, 2011, a fee of \$500 plus unrecoverable airline, hotel and tour operator payments. There is no refund after May 10, 2011, or for unused tour services.

Protect Your Investment: MTS TRAVEL strongly recommends purchasing this primary insurance coverage. If you purchase the protection plan upon enrollment with your deposit, any restriction on pre-existing conditions is waived. If you now have a passport, please verify that it is valid until December 28, 2011. A visa for Israel/Palestine is not required for U.S. citizens.

All rates and fares are based on current information and are subject to change. Rates are based on a minimum of 18 persons traveling together.

Deviations: Any individual making a change in travel arrangements apart from this group program will be charged a service fee of \$100 per person, plus any additional air or land costs incurred.

The itinerary as outlined is an indication of sequence and sites to be included in the tour program. However, the tour operator reserves the right to alter or change the itinerary and/or the sites included should it be deemed necessary due to local conditions, time restrictions, or other circumstances.
