Monday, May 24 **Departure**

Depart New York's JFK International Airport early this evening for the transatlantic flight to Tel Aviv.

Tuesday May 25 **Arrival - Tiberias**



Upon arrival at Tel Aviv's Ben Gurion Airport early this afternoon, drive through the agricultural stretches of the Sharon Plain, carpeted with orange groves and persimmon trees. Continue along the Mediterranean coast to Caesarea Maritima with its magnificent harbor, theater and aqueduct constructed during the reign of Herod. Travel the short distance to Mt. Carmel, the site of Elijah's contest with the prophets of Baal. Head inland to Tiberias along the Sea of Galilee for dinner and overnight at the Leonardo Club Hotel in Tiberias.

Wednesday, May 26 **Nazareth – Sepphoris**

Spend the morning getting acquainted with the home town of Jesus of Nazareth. Visit the spring and Mary's well, and then walk through the present-day bazaar, over the site of ancient Nazareth to the Church of the Annunciation. Spend time at Nazareth Village, a recreation of what life in Nazareth would have been like at the time of Jesus. Drive to nearby Sepphoris, the capital city of the Galilee during the time of Christ, and today a rich archaeological site. Drive to the mound of Megiddo, *har Megiddo* in Hebrew, which gives its name to Armageddon. Continue to Yardenit, the traditional baptismal site along the Jordan River. Those who wish may be baptized in the Jordan River at this time. Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

Thursday, May 27 **The Galilee**



Drive to Kibbutz Nof Ginosar for a visit to the museum displaying the "Jesus Boat," found buried in an exposed section of the lakebed during the drought of 1986. Stop at the Mount of Beatitudes, the site where Jesus delivered His Sermon on the

Mount, overlooking the Sea of Galilee. Drive to Capernaum, used by Jesus as a home base during His ministry. See the remains of the fourth-century synagogue and the nearby house of Simon Peter. Drive north to Caesarea Philippi (Baniyas), a source of the Jordan River located at the base of Mt. Hermon. It is recognized as the place where Peter acknowledged Jesus as Christ. Enjoy a nature walk at Tel Dan and visit the high place where Jeroboam, son of Nebat, set up a golden calf. End the day with a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee before returning to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

Friday, May 28 **Beit Shean – Jerusalem**

Visit the mound of Beth Shean, hearing the story of Saul and viewing the ruins of Roman Scythopolis. Travel south along the Jordan River towards Jericho, stopping at the spring where Gideon asked his men to drink. Ascending the Roman road along Wadi Qilt, stop for a look at St. George's Monastery, built into the cliffside. Stop at the Monastery of the Good Samaritan, believed to be the site where Elijah



was fed by the ravens in the wilderness. Finally, from the top of Mt. Scopus, behold the majestic Holy City of Jerusalem. Over-night at the Ambassador Hotel in Jerusalem.

Saturday, May 29 **Jerusalem**

Begin the day with an orientation to Jerusalem from the Mt. of Olives. Follow the traditional Palm Sunday route to the church known as Dominus Flevit ("the Lord weeps"). After viewing the Golden Gate, walk downhill to Gethsemane and the Church of



All Nations. Drive to Mt. Zion to see the Upper Room, the possible site of the last supper, and visit the Tomb of King David. Stop at the Church of St. Peter of Gallicantu ("cock crow"), possibly the location of Caiaphas' house where Jesus was tried and kept overnight. Continue to the New City to see the model of Jerusalem, representing how the city looked on the eve of the Jewish revolt, 36 years after the Passion of Jesus. Visit the Shrine of the Book, which houses the Dead Sea Scrolls and the Yad Vashem Memorial to Holocaust victims. Return to the Ambassador Hotel for dinner and overnight.

Sunday, May 30 **Jerusalem**

This morning begins inside the Dung Gate at the Davidson Exhibition and Virtual Reconstruction Center at the Old City's Southern Wall excavations. See the southern steps, where Jesus taught, and climb to the Temple Mount to see the Dome of the Rock. Visit the Western ("Wailing") Wall, Judaism's holiest site. Walk through the Western Wall Tunnel, where additional portions of the wall, as well as other structures beneath it, have been excavated. See the Pools of Bethesda and St. Anne's Church before walking along the Via Dolorosa (Way of the Cross) to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. The day ends at the Garden Tomb to reflect on Christ's death, burial and resurrection. Overnight at the Ambassador Hotel.

Monday, May 31 **Dead Sea Area / Optional Departure**

Depart Jerusalem, driving towards the northern edge of the Dead Sea to visit Qumran. View the caves where the Dead Sea scrolls were discovered in 1947. Continue south along the western shore of the Dead Sea to Masada, a high plateau fortified by Herod the Great and the last stronghold of the Jewish Zealots revolt against Rome in 66 AD. Take a cable car to the top of the plateau to visit the ruins and enjoy the spectacular view of the surrounding area.



Persons who are touring Egypt will continue to Eilat, Israel's southernmost city located in the Negev, for dinner and overnight at the Leonardo Club Hotel. Those returning to the US will transfer to Ben Gurion Airport for a late-night departure.

Tuesday, June 1 **Arrive USA / Sinai**

Those returning home today will depart Tel Aviv very early this morning for the U.S arriving at JFK later this same morning.

Pilgrims continuing to Egypt will depart Eilat this morning, crossing the Taba border into Egypt's Sinai Desert, where Moses received the 10 Commandments, Elijah hid from King Ahab and Queen Jezebel, and through which Mary and Joseph fled with

the young child, Jesus. Dinner and overnight at New Morgenland Village near Mount Sinai.

Wednesday, June 2 Sinai



Drive to St. Catherine's Monastery at the foot of Mt. Sinai, where some may wish to make an early morning climb up to Mt. Sinai's summit, 7496 feet above sea level, for a breathtaking view of the landscape of the Sinai at sunrise. St. Catherine's is believed to be the site of

the burning bush, and was once an active religious center. It was built by Emperor Justinian in the 6th century to shelter Christian monks. The monastery also houses a library rich with early Christian manuscripts. Drive through Sinai along the Exodus route to Ismailia for dinner and overnight at Hotel Mercure Ismailia.

Thursday, June 3 Ismailia - Cairo

Begin the day with a visit to Succoth (known today as Tell Al Maskhouta). It was here that the Israelites gathered the day before the Exodus. We will visit ruins of mud brick structures where there is no sign of straw, confirming what is stated in the Bible. At this site, mummies were found during Austrian excavations. Drive

to the land of Goshen, visiting the towns of Ramses and Pithom, which are two Egyptian sites known today as Tell Dabaa and Tell Kantir. During the Middle Kingdom, the reigning pharaoh gave the land to Jacob to breed his animals. Jacob in turn blessed the pharaoh for his generosity; and he called the area the Land of Goshen – a place where the Israelites later grew, flourished and were eventually enslaved. It was here that Moses was born and raised. Continue to Cairo for dinner and overnight at the Pyramids Park Hotel.

Friday, June 4

Cairo



Begin the day in Cairo with a visit to the Church of the Holy Family and the Church of St. Stephen. Travel outside the city to Giza to visit the Great Pyramids of Egypt and the Sphinx. It is one of the largest monolith statues in the world and one of the most

recognized. The remainder of the day is spent at the Egyptian Museum, where many of the treasures of King Tut's Tomb are on display. After dinner transfer to the Cairo Airport for departure.

Saturday, June 5

Arrive USA

Depart Cairo on a very early morning flight and arrive in New York at JFK International Airport this morning.

Please read all Tour Features and Conditions carefully. Payment of tour deposit constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

Air Transportation: Air transportation is restricted to the services of any IATA carrier, in economy class based on nonrefundable fare. Travelers are responsible to provide their names as they appear in their passport. Ticketing will be made 30-45 days prior to departure, after which there will be a charge for name corrections. Tour price includes current airline taxes and fuel surcharges of \$82, which are subject to change until ticketed. *Tour participants are responsible for any increase in airline taxes or fuel surcharges imposed by the airline.*

Accommodations: Based on two or more persons sharing a room in accommodations listed in itinerary, or similar. Single rooms are subject to availability at an additional charge. *If a passenger cannot supply a roommate, the passenger is responsible for the additional charge.*

Meals: In-flight meals and snacks are served according to airline policy. Breakfast, lunches and dinners will be provided daily. Beverages with lunches and dinners are not included.

Transfers and Baggage: Transfers between airports and hotels upon arrival and departure are included in the tour price, including handling of one medium-sized suitcase per person, not exceeding 62 dimensional inches (length plus width plus height) or weighing more than a maximum of 50 pounds. *Due to limited luggage storage space on motorcoaches, it is important that each person bring only ONE piece of checked baggage. In addition, a flight bag or overnight case may be taken, which must be handled by the passenger at all times. Baggage allowance is subject to change according to airline policy.*

Sightseeing and Entrance Fees: Are included as indicated in itinerary, using private motorcoach or other conveyance, with local guides where necessary.

Tips and Taxes: Service charges and taxes on accommodations are included. Tips to guides, drivers, and hotel staff are included. Tips for personal services are not included and are at tour member's own expense.

Not Included: Passport fee, travel protection insurance, and expenses of a purely personal nature are not included. Transportation from your home to JFK International Airport and return is not included.

Deposit and Payment: Reservations may be secured upon payment of a deposit of \$500 per person. You will be invoiced for final payment, which is due March 25, 2010.

MTS Cancellation Conditions: Refund of full deposit (less \$100 administrative fee) will be made up to February 16, 2010. If cancellation occurs between February 17 and April 23, 2010, the fee is \$500 plus unrecoverable airline, hotel and tour operator payments. There is no refund after April 23, 2010, or for unused tour services.

Protect Your Investment: MTS TRAVEL strongly recommends purchasing this primary insurance coverage. If you purchase the protection plan upon enrollment with your deposit, any restriction on pre-existing conditions is waived. If you now have a passport, please verify that it is valid until December 6, 2010. A visa for Israel is not required for U.S. citizens. A visa for Egypt is required and will be obtained for U.S. citizens, provided a copy of the photo page of your passport is received by the MTS TRAVEL office by March 25, 2010.

All rates and fares are based on current information and are subject to change. Rates are based on a minimum of 10 persons traveling together on the Israel-only portion, plus 15 persons traveling together for the full tour.

Deviations: Any individual making a change in travel arrangements apart from this group program will be charged a service fee of \$100 per person, plus any additional air or land costs incurred.

The itinerary as outlined is an indication of sequence and sites to be included in the tour program.
