Meet Your Host

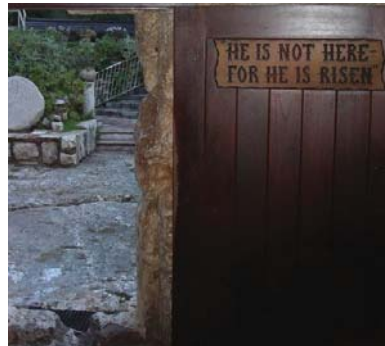
Dr. Al Reichman comes from a long line of orthodox rabbis. He was first exposed to the Gospel when a friend invited him to attend a Vacation Bible School. Two of his sisters attended a youth camp sponsored by the same church and came home having accepted Jesus as their Savior. Al and his sisters began to attend church. It was not until he was a teenager that Al finally came to accept Jesus as his Messiah. Al realized that everything he had been taught about Jesus was true. Trusting Jesus as his Messiah however, came with a high personal cost. His father mourned him as dead and never spoke to him again.

Al and his wife, Michele, served for 17 years in a pastoral ministry and are now on staff with Chosen People Ministries, where Al serves as National Ministries Representative and Southwest Regional Director. His

duties include traveling to churches all across the country sharing his burden of taking the Gospel "to the Jew first, and also to the Greek." He has led many groups to Israel and is anxious for you to see the land he loves so much.

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Monday, October 8 Depart
Evening departure from New York JFK Airport

Tuesday, October 9 Joppa / Tel Aviv
Drive to Joppa. Dinner & overnight in Tel Aviv at Dan Panorama Hotel.

Wednesday, October 10 Northern Israel / Tiberias
See its magnificent harbor, theatre, and aqueduct of Caesarea Maritima. Ascend Mt. Carmel, drive to the mound of Megiddo, and the western side of the Sea of Galilee to climb the Arbel cliff for a spectacular view. Drive to Tiberias for dinner and overnight at the Caesar Hotel.

Thursday, October 11 Upper Galilee /Golan Heights
Enjoy a nature walk at Tel Dan. Continue to Caesarea Philippi (Banias), where Peter answered Jesus' question, "Who do you say that I am?" Ascend the Golan Heights to Shalom Observatory. Visit Gamla, an Early Bronze Age battlefield. Return to Tiberias for dinner and overnight.

Friday, October 12 Sea of Galilee Area
Enjoy a boat ride on the lake and visit the museum's first century fishing boat, found buried under an exposed section of the lakebed. Stop at the site of the Sermon on the Mount. Drive to Tabgha to visit the site of the multiplication of the fish and loaves. Continue to Capernaum to see the remains of the fourth-century synagogue and the nearby house of Peter. Stop to see the remains of Chorazim and Bethsaida, cities condemned by Jesus for their lack of faith. Dinner and overnight in Tiberias.

Saturday, October 13 Dead Sea
Begin the day at Yardenit, the traditional baptism site on the southern tip of the Sea of Galilee. Travel to the Dead Sea, making several stops, including the Decapolis City of Beit Shean, where the Philistines fastened the bodies of Saul and his sons to the wall of the city. Stop at the Beit Alfa Synagogue, constructed in the fifth century on the way to Qumran. Continue along the Jordan River to Qumran to view Cave # 4, which contained the greatest quantity of the Dead Sea scrolls. Enjoy a swim in the Dead Sea. Overnight at the Leonardo Hotel Dead Sea.

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Sunday, October 14 Dead Sea - Jerusalem
Begin the day at the mountain top fortress of Masada. Drive north along the Dead Sea to Ein Gedi, where David hid from Saul in a cave. Travel to Jerusalem and visit Yad Vashem. Overnight at Ramada Jerusalem Hotel.

Monday, October 15 Jerusalem
Beginning our exploration of Jerusalem, visit the Mount of Olives and Gethsemane before entering the Old City. The experience of seeing the Southern Steps, the Pinnacle of the Temple, Western Wall, Rabbi's Tunnel, and Temple Institute, will make this one of the most memorable days of your life!

Tuesday, October 16 Jerusalem
Begin the morning at the Temple Mount, see the Pool of Bethesda, St. Anne's Church, and Gabatha. Continue to the New City to the Israel Museum, housing Dead Sea Scrolls at the Shrine of the Book, and the Model City of Jerusalem. Stop at Yad Hashmona Biblical Garden.

Wednesday, October 17 Jerusalem
This morning explore the City of David, see the Pool of Siloam, visit the Upper Room, the house of Caiaphas, and see David's Tomb. Walk along the Roman Cardo in the Jewish Quarter, and visit the Burnt House. This afternoon share Communion at the Garden Tomb. Enjoy a farewell dinner before transferring to Ben Gurion Airport for our overnight flight.

Thursday, October 18 Arrive U.S.A.
Arrive at JFK Airport early this morning, and make your connections for home.



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
