Friday, January 7**Departure**

Depart by motorcoach from Ephrata/Lancaster area for our flight to Miami, Florida. Upon arrival we will be met and transferred to our hotel.

Saturday, January 8**Miami**

After breakfast, we will be transferred to our luxury liner, the Eclipse. Sail at 4:30 pm. (L, D)

Sunday, January 9**At Sea**

Enjoy an entire day at leisure. Every day aboard the new *ECLIPSE* brings a wealth of activities and indulgences; along with the freedom to partake of as many, or as few, as you please. Luxury and spectacular design are mainstays aboard this floating masterpiece. Enjoy exceptional service, as well. (B, L, D)

Monday, January 10**George Town, Grand Cayman**

Arrive in George Town at 7 am. Once a hideout for some of the most notorious pirates in history, Grand Cayman is now host to visitors eager to peer into the world of Stingray City, charming turtle farms or the crystalline waters of Seven Mile Beach. There is an incredible array of attractions. Sail at 4 pm. (B, L, D)

Tuesday, January 11**Cozumel, Mexico**

Arrive in Cozumel at 9 am. Cozumel's coral reefs make it an underwater sanctuary for hundreds of exotic fish species, while the lush vegetation inland makes it a haven for a range of tropical birds. Noteworthy is the Chankanaab National Park, a Cozumel icon, and the Punta Sur Ecological Reserve. This huge protected area at the southern tip of the island includes Punta Celarain and its historical lighthouse, as well as

the Colombia Lagoon, a shelter for many of the island's endemic species, as well as other endangered forms of life, such as marine turtles and their nesting areas. Just a ferry ride away: the Mayan ruins of Tulum, spectacularly sited on sea cliffs. There are also plenty of water sports such as diving, deep-sea fishing, snorkeling, kayaking and more. Sail at 6 pm. (B, L, D)

Wednesday, January 12**Costa Maya, Mexico**

Arrive in Costa Maya at 8 pm. This quiet side of Mexico opened to passengers in 2001. Costa Maya encompasses huge areas of protected jungle, a number of lesser-known Mayan archaeological sites and indigenous villages. This unspoiled coastal paradise



is home to fantastic coral reefs and pristine lagoons. One important site to see is Chacchoben, a city dating back to around 350 A.D. Another place worth visiting beyond Costa Maya's boundaries is the seaside village of Majahual. Sail at 6 pm. (B, L, D)

Thursday, January 13**Roatan, Honduras**

Arrive in Roatan at 8 am. As you stroll along the shoreline you will understand why the English and Spanish spent so many centuries squabbling over the Isle de Roatan. Roatan is a beautiful

tropical Caribbean island with stunning views of the sea with shades of blue, lush green vegetation, and gorgeous sunsets. A gentle mountain ridge rises from the sea and stretches from the southwest to the northeast. Roatan is the largest of the Bay Islands, which are a part of Honduras, lying just over 30 miles from the northern coast of the Honduran mainland. It is an isle of wonders with lizards that run upright on their hind legs and brilliant macaws and parrots found only in Honduras. They, along with monkeys, live in the wild on this tropical island. An iguana farm east of French Harbor provides a refuge for thousands of iguanas. The coral reefs that lie just offshore are second in size only to Australia's Great Barrier Reef, providing some of the best snorkeling anywhere. Dive attractions include sea walls, shipwrecks, and night diving. Be on the lookout for sea turtles, dolphins, and whales which swim in the waters of Roatan. Sail at 5 p m. (B, L, D)

Friday, January 14**At Sea**

Enjoy a full day at sea with your choice of shipboard activities. (B, L, D)

Saturday, January 15**Home**

After breakfast, we transfer to the airport for our return flight home. A motorcoach awaits to return us to the Ephrata/Lancaster area. (B)

Tour Features and Conditions

Air Transportation: Air transportation is restricted to the services of any IATAN carrier, in economy class based on nonrefundable fare. Travelers are responsible to provide their names as they appear in their passport. Ticketing will be made 60 days prior to departure, after which there will be a charge for name corrections. Tour price includes current airline taxes and fuel surcharges which are subject to change until ticketed. *Tour participants are responsible for any increase in airline taxes or fuel surcharges imposed by the airline.*

Accommodations: Based on two persons sharing a cabin as listed in itinerary, or similar, with private facilities, including service charges and taxes. Single cabin supplement is usually 175% of the tour price. We strongly encourage you to find a roommate. Rates are available upon request. *If a passenger cannot supply a roommate, the passenger is responsible for the additional charge.*

Meals: In-flight meals and snacks are served according to airline policy. All meals on board ship, including 24-hour room service, snacks and buffets.

Transfers and Baggage: Transfers between airports, hotel and ship upon arrival and departure including handling of one medium-sized suitcase per person, not exceeding 62 dimensional inches (length plus width plus height) or weighing more than a maximum of 50 pounds. *In addition, a flight bag or overnight case may be taken, which must be handled by the passenger at all times. Baggage allowance is subject to change according to airline policy.*

Tips and Taxes: Air taxes, port charges, taxes on accommodations and services are included (currently \$251.44). Tips to guides, and shipboard staff are not included. Tips for personal services are not included and are at tour member's own expense.

Shore Excursions: There will be variety of shore excursions available at all ports of call at an additional charge on board ship. Information will be provided with final cruise documents and on board ship.

Surface Transportation: By motorcoach to airport and return for scheduled flight.

Passport Information: United States citizens are now required to have passports for air travel when re-entering the United States. If you do not have a passport, you should apply for one immediately. Information on obtaining a passport will be provided upon receipt of deposit. If you now have a passport, please verify that it is valid until July 2011.

Not Included: Meals not specifically indicated, laundry, beverages with lunch or dinner, trip interruption insurance, tours indicated as optional or sightseeing not mentioned, tips to shipboard personnel, and any other items of a personal nature.

Deposit and Payment: A deposit of \$500 per person is required to secure a reservation for the tour. Final payment is due by October 20, 2010.

Cancellation and Refund Policy: A full refund (except for prepurchased insurance) will be made for written cancellations received no later than October 20, 2010. Passengers who cancel after that date for any reason, including medical reasons, are subject to the following cancellation fees, plus any additional unrecoverable costs. there is no refund for unused tour services.

October 21, 2010–December 2, 2010: \$500 per person

December 3, 2010–December 22, 2010 : 50% of gross fare per person

December 23, 2010 : 100% of gross fare

Given that the resale of cancelled space will likely result in a lost opportunity to sell other space, these fees are due regardless of resale. Fees incurred as a result of cancellation cannot be applied to future bookings.

Name changes require the prior approval of Celebrity Cruises and may not always be possible. Cruise contracts are non-transferrable. Name changes and departure date changes are considered reservation cancellations and are subject to cancellation fees.

Travel Protection: Protect Your Investment: If you purchase the protection plan upon enrollment with your deposit, any restriction on pre-existing conditions is waived. *If protection plan is purchased after the deposit is received, all coverage is subject to exclusion of pre-existing conditions.
