Thursday, May 10 Departure

We begin our pilgrimage of faith by departing from Philadelphia International Airport on British Airways, changing planes in London en route.

Friday, May 11 Arrive Tel Aviv

Upon arrival in Tel Aviv late this afternoon, we will be met by our driver to drive to and check in at Pilgerhaus Tabgha Guest House by the shores of the Sea of Galilee. (D)

Saturday, May 12 Sea of Galilee Area

A day on and around the Sea of Galilee. Begin the day by visiting the Church of the Loaves and Fishes and the Church of the Primacy of St. Peter at Tabgha, celebrating the Eucharist on the lakeshore. Next, drive to the summit of the Mount of the Beatitudes and reflect on Jesus' teaching overlooking the scene of Jesus' Galilean ministry. After lunch at a Galilean restaurant where one may enjoy St. Peter's Fish, continue to Capernaum, the center of Jesus' ministry. End the day sailing on the Sea of Galilee, with time for meditation. Return to the guest house for dinner and overnight. (B, D)



Sunday, May 13 Nazareth

Drive to Nazareth and join members of the local Anglican community for Eucharist at Anglican Christ Church. Visit the Church of the Annunciation, built over the traditional site of the home of Mary and Joseph. Continue to Joseph's workshop and the Synagogue Church, before breaking for a picnic lunch. Visit Sepphoris, a large Herodian Roman city, now a fascinating archaeological site. Visit the village of Cana, the site associated with Jesus' first miracle—the changing of water into wine at the wedding feast. Next, take taxis through a series of switchbacks to the peak of Mount Tabor, which Christians have long identified as the “high mountain” of Matthew 17:1. Return to the guest house for dinner and overnight. (B, L, D)

Monday, May 14 Beit Shean / Caesarea Maritima



Travel south from Galilee to Beit Shean—ancient Scythopolis. View the setting for the death of Saul (1 Samuel 28–2 Samuel 1). Survey the magnificent Roman and Byzantine ruins: consisting of the theater, bathhouses, ancient rest rooms, market areas, and colonnaded streets. Drive west through the Valley of Jezreel and Afula to the

mound of Megiddo, *har megiddo* in Hebrew, which gives its name to Armageddon. Ascend Mt. Carmel, the site of Elijah's confrontation with the prophets of Baal. Drive along the coastal highway to Caesarea by the Sea. Enjoy lunch at a Druze restaurant on Mt. Carmel (not included). Enter Caesarea Maritima and explore this Roman bridgehead to the East, and Christian springboard to the West. After visiting this ancient harbor, travel the historic Beth Horon road (Joshua 10:10) to the Benjamin Plateau, past ancient Gibeon, and continue on to Jerusalem. Behold majestic Jerusalem from atop Mt. Scopus. Dinner and overnight at the Ambassador Hotel in Jerusalem. (B, D)

Tuesday, May 15 Jerusalem

Begin the day on top of the Mount of Olives. Visit the Monastery of Pater Noster, to see the Lord's Prayer inscribed in over 100 languages. Follow the traditional Palm Sunday route to the church known as Dominus Flevit (“the Lord weeps”). Walk downhill to Gethsemane and the Church of All Nations. Cross the Kidron Valley and stop on Mount Zion to visit the Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu, built over the site of the house and the dungeon where Jesus was held overnight before Good Friday. Visit the traditional room of the Last Supper before breaking for an Arabic lunch nearby. Drive to West Jerusalem and walk through the Shrine of the Book, which displays many of the Dead Sea Scrolls found in the caves at Qumran, and see the nearby model of Jerusalem, representing the city as it looked on the eve of the Jewish revolt, 36 years after the Passion of Jesus. Continue to Yad Vashem, the Holocaust Memorial Museum in West Jerusalem. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem. (B, D)



Wednesday, May 16 Dead Sea Area

Drive to Bethany, the home of Mary, Martha and Lazarus. Continue through the Judean desert down to Jericho. Visit the tel of this oldest city and view the traditional mountain of Jesus' temptation. Drive south to Qumran and view Cave # 4, which contained the greatest quantity of Dead Sea scrolls. Continue south to Masada. Take the cable car to the top, visiting Herod's mountain bunker and the last stronghold of the Jewish revolt against Rome (66-73 AD). Conclude the day with a float in the mineral rich waters of the Dead Sea before returning to Jerusalem for dinner and overnight. (B, D)

Thursday, May 17 Jerusalem

Celebrate Eucharist this morning at St. George's Cathedral, an Anglican cathedral established in 1899. It is the seat of the Bishop of Jerusalem of the Episcopal Church in Jerusalem and the Middle East. If available, meet with the priest and some of the people from the church, and learn about their ministry. Also visit nearby St. George's College. Drive around the Old City walls and enter via the

Dung Gate, see the Southern Wall Excavations, and (if permitted) ascend Mount Moriah to view the Dome of the Rock and the Al Aqsa Mosque. Enjoy lunch at a nearby Armenian tavern (not included). Proceed to the Western (Wailing) Wall, the most holy site in Judaism. Walk through the Western Wall Tunnel and visit the Jewish Quarter and Cardo. Visit the Sabeel Ecumenical Liberation Theology Center, a movement among Palestinian Christians working for justice, peace and reconciliation in Palestine/Israel. Dinner and overnight at the Ambassador Hotel. (B,D)

Friday, May 18 Jerusalem / Bethlehem

The Day of the Cross. Travel to St. Stephen's Gate in the Old City and visit the Crusader Church of St. Anne by the Pool of Bethesda and the Convent of the Sisters of Zion built on the foundations of the Roman Antonia Fortress where Jesus was condemned by Pilate. Follow the Way of the Cross along the narrow streets of the Via Dolorosa to Calvary and the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, stopping at each Station of the Cross. Drive to Bethlehem to experience some of the remarkable Christian work there, fostering reconciliation and a better future, at the International Center in Bethlehem. Enjoy a Palestinian lunch at the Center, with the possible opportunity to engage in discussion with Dr. Mitri Raheb, Pastor of the Christmas Lutheran Church in Bethlehem, as well as with other local Palestinians. Drive to Beit Sahour to view the possible location of the Shepherds' Fields. Return to Bethlehem to visit the Church of the Nativity, venerated by Christians of all traditions as the birthplace of Jesus. There will be time for shopping in Bethlehem, an excellent place to purchase hand-carved olive-wood figures and lovely jewelry. Enjoy a special dinner at the Shepherds Valley Village Tent restaurant in Beit Sahour before returning Jerusalem for the night. (B, L, D)

Arrive USA

Depart Jerusalem early this morning for Ben Gurion Airport for the flight home. Arrive this evening at Philadelphia International Airport, with memories that will enhance your Bible study for years to come—because you have walked where Jesus walked.

Payment of tour deposit constitutes acceptance of these conditions.*

Air Transportation: Air transportation is restricted to the services of any IATA carrier, in economy class based on nonrefundable fare. Travelers are responsible to provide their names as they appear in their passport. Ticketing will be made 30-45 days prior to departure, after which there will be a charge for name corrections. Tour price includes current airline taxes and fuel surcharges which are subject to change until ticketed. *Tour participants are responsible for any increase in airline taxes or fuel surcharges imposed by the airline.*

Accommodations: Based on two or more persons sharing a room in accommodations listed in itinerary, or similar. Single rooms are subject to availability at an additional charge of \$575. *If a passenger cannot supply a roommate, the passenger is responsible for the additional charge.*

Meals: In-flight meals and snacks are served according to airline policy. Breakfast and dinner will be provided daily. Opportunity will be given for participants to purchase lunches on their own. Beverages with dinners are not included.

Transfers and Baggage: Transfers between airports and hotels upon arrival and departure are included in the tour price, including handling of one medium-sized suitcase per person, not exceeding 62 dimensional inches (length plus width plus height) or weighing more than a maximum of 50 pounds. *Due to limited luggage storage space on motorcoaches, it is **important** that each person bring only **ONE piece** of checked baggage. In addition, a flight bag or overnight case may be taken, which must be handled by the passenger at all times. Baggage allowance is subject to change according to airline policy.*

Sightseeing and Entrance Fees: Are included as indicated in itinerary, using private motorcoach or other conveyance, with local guides where necessary.

Tips and Taxes: Service charges and taxes on accommodations are included. Tips to guides, drivers, and hotel staff are included. Tips for personal services are not included and are at tour member's own expense.

Not Included: Passport fee, travel protection insurance, and expenses of a purely personal nature are not included. Transportation from your home to Philadelphia International Airport and return is not included. Checked luggage fee charged by the airline.

Deposit and Payment: Reservations may be secured upon payment of a deposit of \$500 per person. You will be invoiced for final payment, which is due March 9, 2012.

MTS Cancellation Conditions: Refund of full deposit (less \$100 administrative fee) will be made up to February 3, 2012. If cancellation occurs between February 4 and April 10, 2012, the fee is \$500 plus unrecoverable airline, hotel and tour operator payments. There is no refund after April 10, 2012, or for unused tour services.

Protect Your Investment: MTS TRAVEL strongly recommends purchasing this primary insurance coverage. If you purchase the protection plan within 21 days of your deposit, any restriction on pre-existing conditions is waived. If protection plan is purchased after the 21 days, all coverage is subject to exclusion of pre-existing conditions. You will have ten days to review coverage and cancel your policy.

A valid passport is required. If you do not have a passport, you should apply for one immediately. Information on obtaining a passport will be provided upon receipt of deposit. If you now have a passport, please verify that it is valid until November 21, 2012. A visa for Israel is not required for U.S. citizens.

All rates and fares are based on current information and are subject to change. Rates are based on a minimum of 16 persons traveling together.

Deviations: Any individual making a change in travel arrangements apart from this group program will be charged a service fee of \$100 per person, plus any additional air or land costs incurred.

The itinerary as outlined is an indication of sequence and sites to be included in the tour program. However, the tour operator reserves the right to alter or change the itinerary and/or the sites included should it be deemed necessary due to local conditions, time restrictions, or other circumstances.
