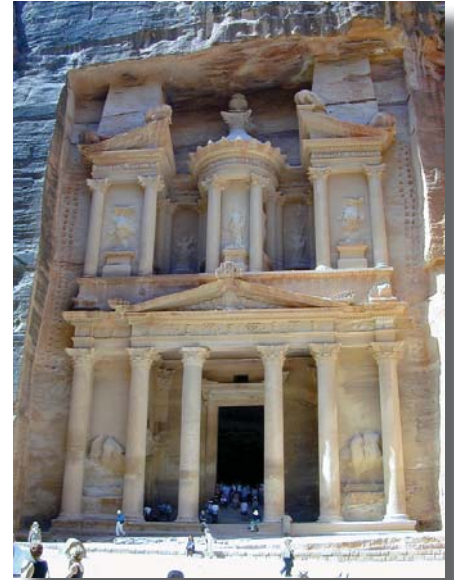

Thursday, February 24 **Departure**

Depart Washington/Dulles Airport this evening, on a transatlantic flight to Vienna, Austria.

Friday, February 25 **Austria / Amman, Jordan**

After changing planes in Austria, arrive at Queen Alia Airport this afternoon and transfer to Amman for dinner and overnight at the Grand Palace Hotel.

Saturday, February 26 **King's Highway and the Dead Sea**

After an early breakfast enjoy a panoramic tour of Amman. Drive through Wadi Mujeb to Umm al Rassas, to view fine examples of mosaic art found there. Continue the drive along the Exodus route, also known as the King's Highway, and pass the well-conserved Crusader city of Kerak en route. End the day at the Petra Panorama Hotel.



Sunday, February 27 **Petra**

Tour Petra, located in the heart of the Seir Mountains mentioned in the book of Genesis. For hundreds of years, Petra was forgotten until it was "rediscovered" in 1812. It must be entered on foot, horseback, camel or donkey cart through a narrow siq (a narrow gorge). The Nabateans carved breathtaking temples and monuments, 800 in all, out of the multicolored sandstone. See the 3,000 seat theatre, the Palace Tomb and the Treasury—the most famous monument appearing dramatically at the end of the siq. Dinner and overnight at the Moevenpick Hotel and Spa on the Dead Sea, where you will have an opportunity to pamper yourself with spa treatments using mineral-rich products from the Dead Sea.

Monday, February 28 **Jordan – The Galilee**

Drive to Madaba this morning to see a 6th century floor mosaic depicting a map of the Holy Land easily recognized by early Christian pilgrims. Visit Mt. Nebo, from which God showed Moses the Promised Land, then continue to the Allenby Bridge to cross into Israel. Visit the ancient tel of Jericho. Visit the mound of



Beth Shean and the archaeological excavations there. It was here that the Philistines fastened the bodies of Saul and his sons to the wall of the city. Visit Gideon's Spring where Gideon chose his army of 300. Dinner and overnight at the Holiday Inn Tiberias.

Tuesday, March 1 **The Galilee Area**

Begin the morning on the Mt. of Beatitudes, the site where Jesus delivered His "Sermon on the Mount," overlooking the Sea of Galilee. Walk down the mountain to Tabgha to visit the Church of the Loaves and Fishes and the Church of St. Peter's Primacy at the northwestern shore of the lake. Continue on to Capernaum to visit the synagogue and the location of the home of Peter according to early Christians. Some may wish to enjoy "St. Peter's Fish" for lunch. Enjoy a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee which ends at Kibbutz Nof Ginosar, for a visit to the museum displaying the "Jesus Boat." This boat, dated to be from about the time of Christ, was found in an exposed section of the lakebed during a drought in 1986. Continue to Yardenit, the traditional baptismal site where the Jordan River flows from the southern tip of the Sea. Dinner and overnight at the Holiday Inn Tiberias.

Wednesday, March 2 **The Galilee Area**



This morning, see the remains of the ancient city of Hazor where Joshua's army slew everything that breathed and paved the way for the Israelite settlement of the Promised Land. Continue to Caesarea Philippi (Baniyas) where Peter answered Jesus'

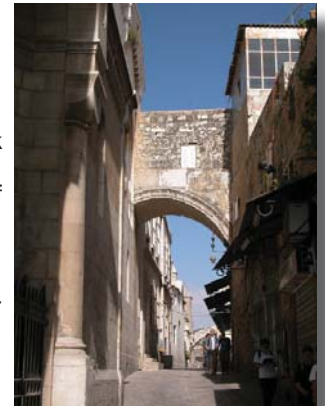
questions, "Who do you say that I am?" Travel to Safed, long a Jewish center of learning and continue on to Bethsaida, the site of Jesus healing a blind man. Dinner and overnight once again at the Holiday Inn, Tiberias.

Thursday, March 3 **Galilee – Jerusalem**

Drive through Cana where Jesus turned the water into wine at the marriage feast. Arrive in Nazareth, hometown of Jesus, and visit Nazareth Village to experience a recreation of the village as it might have been in Jesus' day. Continue to Sepphoris, the largest city in Galilee during the time of Jesus. Drive to the mound of Megiddo, a city overlooking the Jezreel Valley where numerous battles were fought during Old Testament times and where it is believed the battle of Armageddon will take place. Drive to Caesarea Maritima. This Herodian city became the springboard from which Paul took the Gospel to the Gentiles. Built by Herod the Great, this city became the military capital of the Judean province during Roman rule. See the hippodrome, the aqueduct that brought fresh water to the city from Mt. Carmel and a limestone block bearing an inscription mentioning the name of Pontius Pilate. End the day by viewing Jerusalem from the top of Mt. Scopus. Dinner and overnight at the Mount Zion Hotel in Jerusalem.

Friday, March 4 **Jerusalem, the Old City**

Begin the day with an orientation to Jerusalem from the Mt. of Olives. Follow the traditional Palm Sunday route to the church known as Dominus Fleavit ("the Lord weeps"). After viewing the Golden Gate, walk downhill to Gethsemane and visit the Basilica of the Agony (Church of All Nations). Walk through the Jewish Quarter of the Old City to see the remains of the Roman Cardo and Hezekiah's Wall. See the Western Wall and Western Wall Tunnel where you can walk on streets from the time of Jesus. Climb the Southern Steps as you ascend to the Dome of the Rock and the al-Aqsa Mosque, located on the traditional site of the ancient Temple Mount. See the Pools of Bethesda and St. Anne's Church, which is perfectly preserved from the Crusader period, and experience its remarkable acoustics. Follow the Way of the Cross (Via Dolorosa) and stop at the Ecce Homo Arch ("Behold the Man") near Pilate's Judgment Hall on the way to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. Dinner and overnight at the Mt. Zion Hotel.



Saturday, March 5 **Mount Zion / Bethlehem**

Drive to Mt. Zion to see the Upper Room, the possible location of the Last Supper. Visit the Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu ("cock crow"), believed to be the site of Caiaphas' house where Jesus was tried and kept overnight. Leaving Jerusalem, drive to Beit Sahour to see the Shepherds Fields. In nearby Bethlehem, visit the Church of the Nativity, built over the site believed to be the place of Jesus' birth. Return to Jerusalem for dinner and overnight once again at the Mount Zion Hotel.

Sunday, March 6

Qumran / Masada

Travel to Qumran this morning to view Cave #4 which contained the largest quantity of "Dead Sea" scrolls discovered. Travel to Masada, Herod's fortress palace and last stronghold of the Jewish rebellion against Rome. Take a cable car to the top to view the remains of this mighty fortress. Return to Jerusalem through the Judean wilderness where David hid from Saul at Ein Gedi and cut off a portion of Saul's robe. Stop at Genesis Land where visitors experience life as it was in the time of Abraham. Be met by Eliezer, Abraham's servant, and ride upon a camel to Abraham's tent where you will partake of his legendary hospitality and enjoy the evening meal. Return to Jerusalem for dinner and overnight at the Mount Zion Hotel.



Monday, March 7

Jerusalem, the New City

Today begins with a visit to the Shrine of the Book built specifically to house the Dead Sea Scrolls, the earliest copies of Hebrew texts ever found. Nearby is the model of Jerusalem (built 1:50 scale) representing the city during the time of the second temple, located in the Israel Museum. Next visit Yad Vashem, Israel's Holocaust memorial and museum. After lunch, celebrate communion at the Garden Tomb. The remainder of the day is free to explore Jerusalem on your own. A special farewell dinner and overnight at the Mount Zion Hotel.

Tuesday, March 8

Arrive USA

Drive to Tel Aviv early this morning for an early flight to Washington/Dulles Airport. Arrive in the US late in the afternoon. Return home with a richer understanding of the lands of the Bible.

Tour Features and Conditions

Please read all Tour Features and Conditions carefully.

Payment of tour deposit constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

Air Transportation: Air transportation is restricted to the services of any IATAN carrier, in economy class based on nonrefundable fare. Travelers are responsible to provide their names as they appear in their passport. Ticketing will be made 30-45 days prior to departure, after which there will be a charge for name corrections. Tour price includes current airline taxes and fuel surcharges of \$380, which are subject to change until ticketed. *Tour participants are responsible for any increase in airline taxes or fuel surcharges imposed by the airline.*

Accommodations: Based on two persons sharing a room in accommodations listed in itinerary, or similar, with private facilities, including service charges and taxes. Single rooms are subject to availability at an additional charge of \$895. If a passenger cannot supply a roommate, the passenger is responsible for the additional charge.

Meals: In-flight meals and snacks are served according to airline policy. Breakfast and dinner will be provided daily. Opportunity will be given for lunches to be secured by tour members, at their own expense. Beverages with lunches and dinners are not included.

Transfers and Baggage: Transfers between airports and hotels upon arrival and departure are included in the tour price, including handling of one medium-sized suitcase per person, not exceeding 62 dimensional inches (length plus width plus height) or weighing more than a maximum of 50 pounds. Due to limited luggage storage space on motorcoaches, it is **important** that each person bring only **one piece** of checked baggage. In addition, a flight bag or overnight case may be taken, which must be handled by the passenger at all times. Baggage allowance is subject to change according to airline policy.

Sightseeing and Entrance Fees: Are included as indicated in itinerary, using private motorcoach or other conveyance, with local guides where necessary.

Tips and Taxes: Service charges and taxes on accommodations are included. Tips to guides, drivers, and hotel staff are included. Tips for personal services are not included and are at tour member's own expense.

Not Included: Passport fee, travel protection insurance, lunches, beverages with lunches and dinners, and expenses of a purely personal nature are not included. Transportation from your home to Washington Dulles International Airport and vice versa is not included.

Deposit and Payment: Reservations may be secured upon payment of a deposit of \$500 per person. You will be invoiced for final payment, which is due December 24, 2010.

MTS Cancellation Conditions: Refund of full deposit (less \$100 administrative fee) will be made up to November 19, 2010. If cancellation occurs between November 20 and January 25, 2011, a fee of \$500 will be charged, plus unrecoverable airline, hotel and tour operator payments. There is no refund after January 25, 2011 or for unused tour services.

Protect Your Investment: MTS TRAVEL strongly recommends purchasing this primary insurance coverage. If you purchase the protection plan upon enrollment with your deposit, any restriction on pre-existing conditions is waived. If protection plan is purchased after the deposit is received, all coverage is subject to exclusion of pre-existing conditions. A valid passport is required. If you do not have a passport, you should apply for one immediately. Information on obtaining a passport will be provided upon receipt of deposit. If you now have a passport, please verify that it is valid until September 7, 2011. A visa for Israel is not required for U.S. citizens. A group visa for Jordan will be obtained for U.S. citizens at no extra charge, provided that a copy of the photo page of your passport is received in our office no later than December 24, 2010. Copies received after this date will incur an additional fee of \$100 for visa procurement.

All rates and fares are based on current information and are subject to change. Rates are based on a minimum of 35 persons traveling together. Charges will be incurred for individual deviations or special requests apart from the group itinerary.

The itinerary as outlined is an indication of sequence and sites to be included in the tour program. However, the tour operator reserves the right to alter or change the itinerary and/or the sites included should it be deemed necessary due to local conditions, time restrictions, or other circumstances.
